This is Perth Theatre where you will go to see Snow White and The Seven Dames.




This is the entrance to Perth Theatre on Mill Street.

Perth Theatre Box Office



- When you walk inside you may need to collect a ticket from our box office.
- The box office staff at the counter will print a ticket for you.
- Our Front of House team who are called ushers will be working in the building during your visit. They will wear a badge to show you they work at Perth Theatre and they can answer questions you may have. They are happy to talk to you.

This is the ground floor Perth Theatre Café area. You can buy a drink or something to eat here before the performance starts.

The Main House




This is Perth Theatre auditorium where you will sit and watch the show.

- The auditorium will open at 1.15pm and you can take your seat.
- Your ticket will give you a seat number to sit in and our front of house team can help you find the correct seat.

• There are three levels in which you can sit:

Stalls (lowest level), Circle (middle level) and Gods (top level)


Please be in your seat by 2pm.



- When the show is ready to start our ushers will close the auditorium doors. If you need to leave the auditorium at any point this is okay, and our ushers will be there to help you. You can come back into the auditorium at any point if you wish to do so.
- Before the show starts the actors will come on stage and introduce themselves. They will tell you their name and which character they will play during the performance.
- After the actors have said hello to you, they will go backstage and prepare for the start of the show. The actors are now ready to tell you a story on the stage.
- At this point the lights in the auditorium will be lowered but it will not go completely dark.
- The performance will last 2 hours and 20 minutes. This includes a 20 Minute interval. You can buy items from the café during the interval. Our ushers will sell ice cream too.

Breakout Space

- If you do wish to leave the auditorium, you can come to this room for some quiet space. Our ushers will help guide you there.
- This room is called the Joan Knight Studio.



 There will be a show relay playing in this room. The show relay is a live stream of the performance, so you will not miss out on the story being told.

The Actors

'The Baddie'



Left to right: Snow White (Goodie) and Queen Beauty (Baddie)

- The character on the right-hand side of the picture is called Queen Beauty.
- Queen Beauty is the 'baddie'.
- The actress that plays this character is called Helen Logan.

The Panto Dames

- We have two actors playing the seven dames in this performance.
- The actors are called Ewan Somers (Cissy) and Barrie Hunter (Sassy).
- Ewan plays four of our dames: Cissy, Hissy, Glaikit, Hackit.
- Barrie plays three of our dames: Sassy, Gassy and Frank.

Panto Dame

- The Dames wear lots of make-up as part of their costume.
- They will change parts of their costume and the sound of their voice, so you know which character they are meant to be.

What you can expect to see and hear during Snow White and the Seven Dames

- The stage will look different throughout the performance. This is called changing the set. We use different sets as it helps us to tell our story.
- Below are some pictures of our set:



• Some of our scenes are quite dark. The actors will use torches on stage to see where they are going. This has been well rehearsed, and the actors are safe.



This is Snow White, she is played by an actor called Emma Mullen

- The performance may be loud at times, but you are allowed to cover your ears. You can bring ear protectors to the performance, this is allowed.
- After the songs have finished the audience might clap, this shows the actors they have enjoyed the music and dancing. You can clap if you like and you can wave at the actors too.
- The audience might get involved with the performance from their chair.
 This is called audience interaction. You can 'boo' the baddies and clap
 for the goodies. The actors like it when you get involved but you do not
 have to.
- We often use pyrotechnics during our shows. A pyrotechnic is a small controlled explosion on stage which makes a loud bang. For this relaxed performance there will be no pyrotechnics used.
- After the performance is finished the lights will get brighter and you can leave the auditorium. The ushers will be there to help show you the way out of the building. You may leave by a different route than you entered.
