Scottish stand-up and sketches lead a comedy bill that includes Bruce Fummey, Craig Hill, Danny Bhoy, Gary Faulds, Lynne Ferguson, Jim Smith and *The Duncan and Judy Murray Show*, with the stars of *Still Game* reuniting for a special show.

Young ones can join Disney's *Winnie the Pooh and Friends* as Perth Concert Hall's stage turns into the Hundred Acre Wood, and get in on the action in our popular Perth Youth Theatre Summer Schools.

From the tongue-in-cheek 'per il Coglioni' ('for the idiots'), so named because Vivaldi was asked to write in the figures for the continuo player, to the exquisite virtuosity of the Concerto in B flat major, which Vivaldi's French publisher deemed worthy of a collection of 'elite' Italian concertos. Together these works present a snapshot of the extraordinary invention and craft that earned Vivaldi his rightful reputation as master of the baroque concerto.





Booking fees

All quoted prices include a booking fee charged per ticket, ranging from £2.50-£5. These booking fees are non-refundable including in cases of cancelled performances. We charge a booking fee to cover the costs of our ticketing system and issue of tickets, which is still incurred even when events are unfortunately cancelled.

To keep prices accessible, booking fees are waived for lowpriced tickets under £8.50.

Attending your event

Tickets are required to gain entry to all events. Please make sure to bring your physical or digital ticket, ready to be scanned on arrival at the venue.

Concessions
